Analysis

Key: É minor

Meter: 4/4 – medium rock beat

Form: Modified Pop Song – Intro Verse Verse Bridge Verse Coda

Melody: four equal four measure phrases

The arranger has made minor adjustments from the original *Mamas and the Papas* version. Among them include changing the key from C# minor to e minor, adding harmony on the second verse (which had originally been done as a solo), and creating vocal parts for the bridge, which had originally been an instrumental.
